### On The Front

In my first update since taking over as Chair, I thought I would take the opportunity to tell you a little bit about myself and about some of the ideas I have for taking the club forward. Perhaps I could start though by saying a big thank you to the outgoing committee for taking the club to the healthy position it finds itself in. I hope I can continue with that good work.

I have been a member of the club for just over two years, having moved to the area from Surrey to be near my daughter in Wellesbourne, while my wife who has dementia has gone into a nursing home in Kineton. I returned to cycling nearly 20 years ago in my early 50s, not having ridden since I was a teenager.



Shortly after starting to ride again, I joined the South Western Road Club (SWRC) and my cycling really took off from that point. SWRC was formed in the 1930s as a break away from the southwest London branch of the CTC. It is therefore a well-established club with over 200 members. I was a committee member there for several years where I served as sportive secretary, club runs secretary and as the organiser of their annual sportive event – the May Flyer. Most of the ideas I have for taking our club forward come from the experience I gained in the SWRC. Some of these may work well in the Wellesbourne Wheelers, while others will be less relevant. The Committee really need your input to tell us what will work

for you as we start to develop our ideas.

The first thing I would like to see is for us to function as one club rather than as a number of disparate groups. I ride with the Sunday Club and Hastings groups and I know the people I ride with very well, but only a few other people. At SWRC, at least until the onset of Covid restrictions, all groups used to meet at the same place for several rides to start at the same time. This was a great melting pot for members to get to know each other and for informal coaching and encouragement to take place. Riders could decide which group to ride with on the day and could try out something more challenging in a relaxed atmosphere. One of the ideas I have is for groups to meet for the start of their rides at the same time and place.

I would like the Wellesbourne Wheelers to become a club where riders can fulfil their full potential as cyclists. The common starting time could be a simple way of contributing to this. My own experience at SWRC was that I started riding with the slowest group and felt quite comfortable with that. After a short while however, I was being gently encouraged to try something a little more demanding. I was also encouraged to take part in some local sportive events. After a year or so I found that I was leading one of the more challenging groups and I was taking part in regular sportives including some the famous events in the Alps, Dolomites and the Pyrenees.

Another way of helping riders to develop their full potential could be for us to introduce some additional annual awards, based on more objective measures. For example, prizes for those with the



highest mileage or the most ascent. We could have a prize for the fastest time over the club time trial circuit and potentially have a hill climb competition over a selected Strava segment.

Finally, I would like us to develop a spending plan whereby we can use your subscriptions to contribute to things which will benefit our members. Some ideas based on my previous experience could include first aid course for cyclists, bike maintenance sessions and contributions to the cost of taking part in cycling events outside our area. Again, I should emphasise that these are just suggestions based on what I have seen working in the past. The committee really want to hear your ideas on what we should do to develop the club and so perhaps you could start to feed these to us through your Group Organisers.

I look forward to meeting and riding with as many of you as I can over the year to come.
